

# My Vote My Voice Accessible Voting Campaign

# Who are we?

- My Vote My Voice is a nationwide alliance of disability advocates and organisations launched in February 2023.
- Led by United Response, Dimensions UK, Mencap, and Ambitious about Autism.
- Funded by the UK Democracy Fund, we are a non-partisan campaign.
- We want to help more autistic people and people with learning disabilities register to vote in the next general election.



## Why do we need this campaign?

- Better awareness just 40% of the general public know that disabled people have the equal right to vote.
- Better accessibility 80% of the general public believe that polling stations are inaccessible for people with learning disabilities.
- Better engagement disabled people were less likely to vote during the 2023 local elections partly due to many not having acceptable voter ID.
- Better representation only 16% of elected councillors and less than 2% of current MPs are open about their disabilities.

> "Loads of manifestos aren't in Easy Read, so it's harder for people with disabilities or whose first language isn't English to know who to vote for and what they're voting for. The government don't put out the Easy Read manifestos first, they put it out second or closer to the voting date so that's why it's not going to be more accessible."

"I've supported several people going to the polling station . . . sometimes the people I've supported didn't want to go until later in the evening because they were a little bit scared that they might get discriminated against . . . there's been real tension if I'm walking in with somebody who might be non-verbal or physically disabled, and there's a pushback from some of the people running the station and even members of the public."

# My Vote My Voice's aims

- Build a national alliance of supporters to help share educational resources about elections and people's democratic rights.
- Mobilise My Vote My Voice members to support 211,000+ autistic people and people with learning disabilities to register to vote at the next general election.
- Collect data and people's experiences of voting to help us think of new ideas to improve access to voting.



### **Our Resources**

- Easy Read guides how to register to vote, applying for a voter authority certificate, what to expect at a polling station, what MPs do for you, etc.
- Accessible explainers election terms glossary, who the political parties are and what they stand for, how the government works, main news items, etc.
- Campaigning tools election workshop plans, letter templates to write to MPs and election candidates, etc.
