How the project will work



Llywodraeth Cymru Welsh Government

The **Welsh Government** is giving money to help this project. The project will help Deaf and disabled people in different ways, like:

1. Cross-Party Disabled Person Politics Network

This will:

- Give Deaf and disabled people support from others like them.
- Help people learn about politics and how to become a candidate.

2. Access to Politics Charter for Wales

• Show political parties the best ways to include Deaf and disabled people.

- Ask all political parties in Wales to follow the Charter.

4. Speaking up for Deaf and disabled People

This will:



• Make sure Deaf and disabled people can take part in politics.



 Follow Article 29 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Disabled People. This rule says disabled people should be able to take part in all parts of life, like politics, work, and school.
